# **STUDENT SUCCESS**

Equitable Access (EA) programs provide first-day access to required course materials so students are prepared to learn on the first day of class and instruction can start right away. EA programs can have a positive impact on student success, including higher course completion rates and higher retention rates.


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Research suggests that students who opt out of an EA program are 15.5% less likely to complete course than those who stayed in the program.\*

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The University of California, Davis found that 58.4% of students who opted out in Fall 2020 and 60.6% of students who opted out in the Spring 2021 did not acquire all their course materials elsewhere.\*

86% of students agreed [EA] better prepared them for the academic term.

83% of students say [EA] had a positive impact on their success this term.

75% of students say EA helped them achieve better grades this term.

### **STUDENT SAVINGS**

EA can result in significant cost savings for students. These savings can help alleviate financial stress and improve access to course materials for all students.



#### **Appalachian State University**

Digital textbook rentals boast 99% participation rate, saving students over \$5 million in 2022-2023.



#### **Cornell University**

For the Fall 2022 semester, it's estimated that students saved a total of \$1.6 million with EA, compared to a traditional printcentered model.



#### University of California, Davis

Because EA lowers the overall program cost to the institution, UC Davis has been able to give out over14,500 grants to date, totaling about \$2.45million. Did you know?




In the 2022-2023 academic year, the average savings netted out to nearly \$70 million in student savings through IA and EA programs powered by VitalSource.\*

Students in EA programs spent less on course materials than other students. Students enrolled in an EA program spent an average of \$244 compared to \$295 among non-EA students.\*\*

### **Institutional Control of Revenue**

School 2 saw about 1.54 times growth from IA to EA

School 3 saw about 2 times growth from IA to EA.


# **STUDENT PARTICIPATION**
